

International Access to Fort Huachuca

Fort Huachuca is an active military installation and specific entrance requirements are enforced. U.S. citizens may enter the post with a visitor pass, received at the Main Gate of the post. Required documentation includes: vehicle registration and insurance (or rental car agreement), as well as current and valid photo identification for driver and all passengers age 18 and older.

Current regulations stipulate that international visitors must be escorted throughout their stay on the post. Presently, the CVB has a program in place to assist groups with an escort.

- In order to procure an escort and request preliminary approval from the post, the group must apply to the CVB.
- One escort per 15 foreign visitors.
- The size of the group determines the length of time necessary to procure a guide and request approval. For 15 or fewer, the group must request approval at minimum three weeks prior to the visit. For a larger group, additional time is required.
- A gratuity of \$50/half day and \$100/full day for each escort - to be given by the group directly to the escort.
- If the group wishes a birding expert (instead of solely an escort), the expert determines the fee and it is negotiated directly with the group and expert.
- Everyone in the group must have proper documentation (passport and visa (if required))
- The group provides the transportation on the post and must include seating space for the escort(s) as the escort(s) must be with the group at all times.
- It is not guaranteed that an escort will be available even if all the above requirements are met.
- If national security levels change, then entrance requirements may also change without notice.
